Welcome to **MAPLERIDGE RANCH SUMMER 2026**! We are so honored that you chose us and we are looking forward to getting to know each and every one of your children this summer. Your camper's time at the Ranch is sure to be one filled with adventure, memories, friendships, and growth! Enclosed you will find some very important information regarding the camp, so **please take time to read through it carefully**. ARRIVAL AND DEPARTURE: (See Pages 8-9 for Additional Information)

Campers arrive on Sundays starting at 4:00 PM, decked out in their team colors (see below)! **The Ranch entrance will not be open before 4:00 pm**. Be sure to arrive with your luggage tags printed and attached to all of your camper's bags ([PRINT LUGGAGE TAG](#))!

Opening Day Check-In Times (By Last Name):

To help with traffic flow and parking, please **DO NOT** arrive prior to your camper's designated check-in time. (If you are bringing campers with multiple last names, simply defer to the earliest designated check-in time)

We will not receive any campers prior to 4:00 PM. Our desire is to provide you with the best Opening Day experience possible, so please do not arrive early. There is no rush, and these staggered arrival times allow us to do just that!

Departure Saturday Morning:

8:45 a.m. Gates Open (load up luggage in car)

9:30 a.m. - 10:30 a.m. Closing Ceremony (goodbye hugs and tears:)

***We don't recommend bringing your child late or picking them up early, but we understand that circumstances sometimes make this necessary. If that is the case, please be sure to contact the camp office for arrangements to be made. (Dropping campers off early is not permitted.)

TRAVEL INFORMATION:

The Ranch does not assume responsibility for arranging transportation to camp, but we are eager to assist. If your child requires transportation to camp from the airport, your child **MUST** fly into the Syracuse Hancock International Airport (SYR). A camp shuttle will be available to pick up campers **ONLY** on Sunday from 12:00-2:30 PM. Campers arriving before this time window will need to wait for Camp Staff to arrive. Campers' flights must depart on Saturday, and the shuttle will drop all campers off at the SYR airport at 10:00 AM.

See the [Flight Information Sheet](#) for more detailed information on this process. Please confirm all flights with Camp Staff and ensure you fill out the ***Transportation Form on CampMinder***. We ask that **ALL** campers fill this form out, even if you are driving to camp.

HOMESICKNESS:

Sending your child to camp for the first time can be scary, and we understand that you may have some concerns or reservations. We want to assure you that even though for some there may be a few tears on the first day, we actually don't experience much homesickness beyond that. The excitement of camp is contagious and before you know it, closing day comes and they don't wanna leave! Being homesick and "living through it" can be a great life lesson for the child... and the parent! You can rest assured that our staff is trained to expect this and handle it with patience and sensitivity. We will let you know if there are any serious problems that need addressing.

That being said, you can help to prepare your child by being positive about camp and discussing what to expect. Let them know that missing home is "ok" and doesn't usually last long. Saying things like "I know you, and you're gonna do great!" or "I can't wait to hear about all the people you meet!" shows them that you are confident in them and their ability to adjust. Try not to transfer your own fears of being apart onto them... try to keep those feelings to yourself:)

!WATER BOTTLES!

Each camper is required to have a water bottle to use throughout the week. If your camper does not come with a water bottle, you will need to purchase a **MAPLERIDGE** one for \$15 in the Hitching Post upon arrival.

CAMPOUT BACKPACKS

Campout is one of our favorite parts of the week at MAPLERIDGE! Please ensure that your child brings a backpack for campout that is big enough for them to carry their belongings plus campout supplies and food that counselors will distribute between everyone in the cabin. Many staff members have enjoyed camping or hiking backpacks, which may be a good idea for birthday presents for older campers!

TEAM SPIRIT

Here at MAPLERIDGE, team competition to compete to be CHAMPS OF CAMP is one of our favorite parts of the week! Your camper's team color will be released via email shortly before their session of camp begins. We encourage all campers to **come to camp on Sunday wearing their team colors** and decking completely out in their spirit gear for our Sunday night Quest game! To help you out, we also offer some MAPLERIDGE color gear in our pop-up spirit shop on opening day! There will be t-shirts, sweatbands and bandanas for sale right outside the Hitching Post. Campers will also wear their team color for **COLOR WAR** on Friday (see below), where their clothes will likely be ruined, so pack accordingly!

CLOTHING GUIDELINES:

Shorts should be of a modest length.

Leggings are permitted as long as they are worn with a longer top.

No bras, undergarments, or midriffs showing.

Bathing suit should be modest, 1-piece, and appropriate for games in and outside the pool.

(Tankinis are not considered 1-piece).

If clothing is deemed inappropriate, campers may be asked to change.

PLEASE NOTE:

Many of the items in the WHAT TO BRING list reflect the unusual climate here in the upstate New York region. This area can experience extremely varied temperatures in the summer, as high as 90 and as low as 40 degrees. Not only does it vary in temperature, but also in precipitation... when it's dry it's DRY, and when it's wet it's WET! Rain can go on for hours or days and is usually pretty cold. Also, the grounds are very rugged here, and often wet and muddy... Please pack accordingly!

Remember, camp is fun, you WILL get dirty, and clothes do get ruined... pack accordingly! In addition, please label all clothing and belongings. Any items not claimed from the Lost & Found on closing day will be donated to a local charity.

BEST WAY TO PACK:

Make sure everything is packed inside a piece of luggage, trunk or container. Any loose items will need to be carried by your camper. **All luggage must have an attached Luggage Tag.** [PRINT LUGGAGE TAG](#)

We have found an old-school trunk or footlocker can house all of your camper's belongings and is the easiest way for us to haul their things to the cabins. A trunk can be a great item that is used year after year, and campers love "decorating" them with stickers and such! A rubbermaid-type bin can also be practical.

Walmart and Target both offer affordable options for trunks and bins, however, if you are looking for a trunk that stands the test of time, we recommend C&N Footlockers at everythingsummercamp.com/CNtrunks.

HITCHING POST:

The Hitching Post is our camp store. We do not allow cash in camp but parents may deposit money into their camper's "account" upon arrival to purchase t-shirts, sweatshirts, stickers, water bottles, snacks, drinks and crafts. We recommend between \$40-\$50 per session. Money not spent can be collected before departure on Closing Day. Any change or cash not picked up will be donated to the camp's scholarship fund.

WHAT NOT TO BRING:

Your camper should not bring expensive valuables to camp such as; watches, jewelry, costly cameras, etc. **Cell phones, laptops, iPods, iPads, tablets, Gameboys, and PSP's** should not be brought to camp. We strive for all of our staff and campers to get away from all distractions and enjoy nature! If a camper does bring one of these items, it will be locked in the office until the end of the week. We also have a "no cash in camp" policy. All money needs to be checked in to the Hitching Post upon arrival and change can be picked up before departure.

SKILL PERIODS

Every camper will be able to choose three **(3)** skills to participate in throughout their week of camp. These skills may include canoeing, fishing, archery, riflery, crafts, horseback riding, climbing, and much more! Skill selection takes place at camp on Sunday night with your child's counselors. We will do our best to make sure that each camper gets their top three as much as possible!

HORSEMANSHIP is available to all campers and costs an **additional \$100**. If your child is interested in the Horsemanship program, please go online and register in advance. There are limited spots, and they fill up fast!

HEALTH AND DIETARY NEEDS

FOOD IS SERVED!

Our meals are graciously prepared by a wonderful kitchen staff who work hard to prepare meals that our campers will enjoy. Well-balanced meals that are wide in variety keep camper's energy up and their spirits high. If your camper has allergies or requires special dietary needs, please **let us know in advance** so we can be sure to accommodate them as much as possible!

HEALTH AND MEDICATIONS:

If you haven't already, please make sure you go online and fill out all necessary health and release forms as they are **due one week before your child's arrival!**

Please Note - MRR Medication Administration Form: In order for our Health Director to administer prescription medications, you must have turned in a Medication Administration Form, *signed by the prescribing physician!* We will not administer any prescriptions, without this form signed. Any prescription medications you pack will need to be properly labeled with your camper's name and dosages. They will be turned in to the nurse upon arrival, and will be administered as prescribed.

THEME NIGHTS

THEME DINNER

Each Tuesday of camp will have a different “theme”. This will not only play out in songs, games, videos, and skits, but that night campers and staff are encouraged to wear outfits or accessories that go along with the theme. Everyone here at camp has a lot of fun with this and we highly encourage campers to get involved!

SUMMER 2026 THEMES: *Celebrating 250 Years of American Independence from Sea to Shining Sea!*

This summer we’re traveling across America as we celebrate 250 years of our great nation! Each week we’ll spotlight a different region of the country with a fun theme night. From sports teams and pop culture icons to famous historical figures and regional traditions, there are endless ways to get creative and represent each part of the country. We’ll also post some outfit inspiration on our social media accounts - be sure to check it out!

SESSION 1: Pacific Coastin’ - Sunsets, surfboards, and star power. From the Golden Gate to Hollywood and the Pacific waves, this night is all about laid back West Coast energy. Think surfers, skaters, and Hollywood stars!

SESSION 2: Heartland Horizons - Fields of gold, county fairs, small town pride, and Midwest classics. Overalls, plaid, straw hats, vintage farm looks, race day vibes, or your favorite Midwest sports teams all belong here.

SESSION 3: Southern Nights - Bright lights, football fields, country music, beaches, and back porches. From Nashville neon to SEC Saturdays to Florida beaches, this night brings all things Southern charm. Sundresses, polos, boots, camo, country concert style, beach chairs, or your favorite Southern team colors all work.

SESSION 4: Polar Paradise - From Alaska’s wild frontier to island paradise, this theme stretches from icy tundra to tropical shores. You might bundle up like an Arctic explorer with winter hats, or go full island mode with Hawaiian shirts and bright florals. Snow goggles or surf vibes — both fit the adventure!

SESSION 5: Rugged Rockies - Big mountains. Big adventure. Big spirit. Channel national parks, ski towns, campfires, and cowboys. Whether you go “granola” with beanies and hiking boots, Montana cattle rancher with boots and spurs, or something else, you’ll be sure to capture that Rocky Mountain feel.

SESSION 6: Cactus Country - Desert sunsets and wide open skies. From Texas pride to Route 66 to Southwest rodeos, this night celebrates that Southwestern style. Think boots, bandanas, denim, desert colors, turquoise, and bull riders!

SESSION 7: Yankeeland Dreams - Colonial history meets big city lights. From lighthouses and lobster boats to Broadway and historic Boston, this night celebrates the spirit of early America and modern Northeast pride. Nautical stripes, Founding Fathers, baseball legends, or New York swagger all fit the dream.

FANCY DINNER NIGHT

Once again, we are continuing with our tradition at **MAPLERIDGE** which is known as “Fancy Dinner” Night. Every Thursday Night we will have a nicer meal and campers will be encouraged to wear something a little more “fancy” to dinner and chapel that night. We’re not talking dresses and suits, but we do recommend that ladies wear jeans and a cute shirt, and gentlemen wear a button-down (or something along those lines)!

COLOR WARS AND SOLIDARITY:

Fridays are special days at camp! We culminate our team competition with what we call COLOR WARS, a high-energy, multi-game, challenge where every team brings their team spirit and comes ready to win Champs of Camp! Be prepared to be all decked out in your team color... but please know COLOR WARS is a messy endeavor, so be prepared for clothes to be ruined.

After COLOR WARS, we all come together as one **MAPLERIDGE** family in SOLIDARITY. This is our closing ceremony and bonfire... a night filled with tradition and reflection. To signify our unity we ask all campers and staff to come to this event wearing the free Camper Tee that is provided to all campers on Friday.

CAMP RULES

Here at **MAPLERIDGE**, we don't believe in having lots of rules, but we do have a few Golden Rules that we take seriously and ask all Campers and Staff to abide by:

- No Guys in Girls' cabins
- No Girls in Guys' cabins
- Use of cigarettes, tobacco, alcohol, or drugs is prohibited
- No leaving Cabin or Campsite after "lights out"
- No indecent/profane language
- Harming another camper (i.e. bullying, hitting, kicking, making fun of, or demeaning comments) will not be tolerated.

***The breaking of any of these rules is considered a serious offense and parents will be notified. There is a possibility that a child will be sent home for committing these offenses, and in that event, no refund will be given.

COMMUNICATIONS

CELL PHONES, VISITS, ETC.:

Because we know the importance of "getting away" from all of life's distractions, and we want to ensure your child's safety and maintain a proper chain of communication, cell phones are not allowed at **MAPLERIDGE**. We do not view this as a restriction but rather a great experience for them to hopefully embrace!

Part of the experience of being at camp is learning to be independent away from home. We generally do not allow campers to call home or receive calls except in the case of an emergency.

BIRTHDAYS:

On occasion, we have campers celebrating their birthdays while at camp. If your camper's birthday is during their camp stay, please email us at info@mapleridgeranch.org. We will do our best to make sure they have an awesome birthday!

SNAIL MAIL:

In today's world of instant gratification and communication, there is NOTHING like receiving a letter or care package from the people you care about! We encourage you and your friends/family to correspond with your camper through letters and cards this summer. Opening Day Check-In- What to Expect:

1. **Arrival Times**-To help with traffic flow and parking, PLEASE do not arrive prior to your camper's designated check-in time. Gate will NOT be open prior to check-in. (If you are bringing campers with multiple last names, simply defer to the earliest designated check-in time)
 - **4:00 PM | Staff Kids & Airport Shuttle**
 - **4:20 PM | Last Names A-F**
 - **4:40 PM | Last Names G-L**
 - **5:00 PM | Last Names M-R**
 - **5:20 PM | Last Names S-Z**
2. **Luggage Drop-Off** – When you arrive, our staff will greet you and collect your camper's luggage directly from your vehicle.
3. **Park Your Vehicle** – After luggage is unloaded, you'll be directed to a designated parking area.
4. **Check-In at the Upper Room** – Head to the second floor of the Barn (The Upper Room), where you will visit the following stations in no particular order.
 - **REGISTRATION**- Register with Office Assistant.
 - **HEAD CHECK**- Lice Screening.
(You will receive a green sticker upon completion to add to your luggage tags.)
 - **NURSE**- Check-in with our nurse and turn in meds.
 - **CAMPER ACCOUNTS**- Add funds to your Camper Account for the store/ crafts.
 - **REFRESHMENTS**- Enjoy some light refreshments!
 - **VISION & LEGACY**- Stop by and see the future of MRR!
5. **Hitching Post**- Swing by camp store to check out the new merch and make purchases!
6. **Drop Off Camper**- Head over to your camper's cabin to meet their counselor... big hugs and goodbye!

Closing Day Check-Out- What to Expect:

1. **Arrival Time-** Please arrive no earlier than 8:45 AM.
2. **Park Your Vehicle –** Our staff will direct you to the designated parking area.
3. **Check-Out at the Upper Room –** Head to the second floor of the Barn (The Upper Room), where you will visit the following stations in no particular order.
 - **REGISTRATION-** Show I.D. and receive your wristband for approved pick-up.
 - **CRAFTS-** Pick up your camper's crafts.
 - **NURSE-** Pick up your camper's meds.
 - **CAMPER ACCOUNTS-** Pick up your camper's remaining Hitching Post funds.
(Any unclaimed money will be donated to the MRR scholarship fund.)
 - **REFRESHMENTS-** Enjoy some light refreshments!
 - **VISION & LEGACY-** Stop by and see the future of MRR!
 - **LOST & FOUND-** Make sure you check the lost and found!
 - **LUGGAGE-** Pick up your camper's luggage.
4. **Pick Up Camper-** After check-in, head to your camper's team-specific pick-up location. Counselors will not release campers without confirming the proper wristband.
 - **Yellow Team –** Basketball Court
 - **Green Team –** Volleyball Court
 - **Black Team –** Pavilion
 - **Blue Team –** Flagpole
5. **Stop by the Camp Store-** Pick up any last-minute camp gear, snacks, or souvenirs!

Closing Celebration will begin promptly at 9:30 AM! Join us as we celebrate the week, hear highlights from campers and staff, and give thanks for all God has done!

(All stations will be closed at this time, and reopened immediately following the presentation. Any unclaimed campers will need to sit with staff until Closing Celebration is over and confirmation can be made.)
